Is it summer yet?

When the weather outside is cold and snowy or rainy here are some fun tips you can use to keep your dog occupied.

ROW! Calculate your dog's ROW (Rate of Wagging) per minute.

Interactive puzzle toys are a great way to entertain your pet. They tap into your pet's natural instincts. These toys dispense treats as your pet plays with them, so they're a great distraction -- until all of the treats have been eaten. Just Google "Interactive Puzzle Toys" to find a great selection online or visit your nearest pet store.

Foster dog Buster really likes the iQube.
It is a plush cube with three squeaky ball toys that are placed within the cube for your dog to figure out how to get them out.

Teach an old dog a new trick! Play Hide and Seek with a favorite toy (or person) or teach your dog a new trick. Check out Kyra Sundance and her dog Chalcy at www.DoMoreWithYourDog.com for ideas and tips on tricks. Her book, "The Dog Tricks and Training Workbook" will help you engage and bond with your dog and it even comes with a DVD.

Brush up on basic commands. Dogs with good manners get invited into more of the family's life. Taking a class is great socialization for you both and will get your pooch out of the house to socialize with other people and dogs.

Set up a canine play date! Most dogs love to interact with other dogs so finding a playmate is a great way to give your dog some free time to romp with some pals.

Doggy Day Care! 4-Legged Friends Doggy Daycare in Livonia is a great place for your dog to hang out and meet new furry friends in a safe and secure environment.

Foster homes are the lifeblood of our organization. The number of homeless dogs we can save is directly related to the number of foster homes we have available. **WE NEED MORE FOSTER HOMES. WE NEED YOU!**

Have you ever thought about fostering a dog? We can tell you that each foster experience is unique. You might foster an adult dog who is housetrained, well-socialized, and easily makes friends with other dogs, people and kids. Or maybe you will consider taking in a young pup who needs your help in potty training and requires lots of exercise and attention. You may even accept an older dog who may need daily medication or an occasional trip to the vet. There are some dogs who come to us scared and may need your patience and nurturing as they learn to trust humans again. As you can see, the experiences are as varied as the dogs but we will do our best to match incoming dogs to your family and lifestyle.

Waggin' Tails will supply pet food, all vet expenses, collars and leashes, crates, and basically everything you would need for the foster dog. There is very little expense for our fosters. Our foster homes act as a safe haven between shelter and forever home, where we learn about the personality and needs of each dog, which helps us match dogs to potential adopters. In return, we ask our foster homes to provide some basic level of obedience and help our dogs adjust to life in a home, making the transition to their final home as easy as possible. We ask our fosters to actively partner in helping place the dog and make him available to prospective adopters at adoption events. Our seasoned volunteers will help every step of the way.

It has been described as the sweetest heartbreak you'll ever have. It is a labor of love, a test of patience, a testimony to strength and endurance. It is foster care, and there are angels all over the country fostering homeless animals just like we do.

All of us can probably recite in chronological sequence every name of every foster dog who has shared our homes. Be part of something bigger than yourself. Foster!

It is hard to say how long foster placement will last. Super cute pups and dogs with no issues tend to get placed in a month or so while dogs of "less-preferred" breeds, older dogs, and dogs with limitations tend to take longer. As soon as dogs arrive, we place their photos, videos, and biographies on sites like Petfinder.com and Adoptapet.com so that potential adopters can find them. Our group also attends adoption events twice per month so that people can come out and meet our adoptable dogs.

The shelters in our state are overflowing with really good dogs who deserve a second chance. If you think it is time to open up your home and heart to a dog down on his luck then please contact us about fostering today!

Legislation

PUPPY PROTECTION ACT announced at Michigan capital in February!

This legislation was launched by a state wide collaboration by Puppy Mill Awareness, a Michigan-based advocacy group, MHS, Michigan Veterinary Medical Association and the Michigan Association of Animal Control Officers. This legislation is needed to protect animals from breeders who house large numbers of dogs in close confinement for years. In some cases, these dogs do not even have enough room to turn around in and can only walk on wire cage bottoms. In many cases, these breeder dogs have no human contact, exercise, or medical care and are forced to produce litter upon litter. When these dogs become too old to produce litters they are sold, given up or killed. The pet store puppy is likely to have come from a large-scale breeder.

These bills would establish strict guidelines for housing, sanitary conditions, enclosure space, exercise and veterinary care for dogs used for breeding. The Puppy Protection Act also places a limit on the number of dogs that may be housed in such facilities. Seven other states have passed puppy mill laws in the last two years including Ohio, Indiana and Pennsylvania.

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

Contact the Chairs of the House Regulatory Reform Committee and the Senate Agriculture Committee, and ask them to put these bills up for a vote!
